


STAR® ROSES *and* PLANTS  
**TREE PROGRAM**



**CAROLINA SWEETHEART® CERCIS**   
*Cercis canadensis 'NCCCI'* PP 27,712

Carolina Sweetheart® has pink flowers, followed by attractive, variegated foliage. Rich maroon leaves spread out in early spring, eventually becoming green with white margins. It displays the elegant, broad, heart-shaped leaves expected from a redbud tree. Developed through the combined efforts of NCNLA and NC State University.

ZONES: 5–9	FOLIAGE: Green, white & pink
FLOWER: Light pink	HABIT: Small tree, 20–30' h x 30' w

**FLAME THROWER® CERCIS**   
*'NC2016-2'* PP 31,260

This highly impressive redbud boasts perfectly pink flowers and show-stopping foliage that emerges burgundy-red and turns bright yellow and green as it ages. Stunning color display is persistent throughout the season, often showing four to five different shades on a single branch! Developed by the JC Raulston Arboretum at NC State University.

ZONES: 5–9	FOLIAGE: Red, yellow & green
FLOWER: Pink	HABIT: Small tree, 15–20' h x 15' w



**GOLDEN FALLS® CERCIS**   
*Cercis canadensis 'NC2015-12'* PP 31,658


Golden Falls® offers pink blooms, followed by breakthrough foliage color for a weeping Cercis. In spring, new growth is tinged with orange, followed by bright gold leaves that hold up well in the sun and heat. The narrow, weeping architecture of this variety lends itself well to small garden spaces. Developed by the JC Raulston Arboretum at NC State University.

ZONES: 5–9	FOLIAGE: Golden yellow to lime green
FLOWER: Pink	HABIT: Weeping tree, 8–10' h x 3–4' w

**CERCIS 'PINK POM POMS'**   
*Cercis canadensis 'Pink Pom Poms'* PP 27,630

This Cercis offers the most unique, fully double, pink flower clusters, reminiscent of pom poms, that emerge in spring and are followed by large, green, heart-shaped foliage. This plant will not produce seed pods. Developed by the JC Raulston Arboretum at NC State University.

ZONES: 5–9	FOLIAGE: Green
FLOWER: Pink	HABIT: Medium tree, 12½' h x 12' w (at 8 years of age)



## LITTLE RUBY® CORNUS

*Cornus hybrid 'NCCH1' PP 26,542*

Little Ruby® Cornus is the first to be released in a new line of hybrid dogwoods developed by NCSU's Dr. Tom Ranney. This compact shrub is great for mass plantings but is equally beautiful as a specimen tree. The semi-double pink flowers are very attractive, and the bright red leaves on new growth turn to a rich maroon, which persists into late fall.

ZONES: 6b–10	FOLIAGE: Bright red to maroon
FLOWER: Pink, red bracts	HABIT: Compact, dense shrub, small tree, 8–12' h x 6–8' w

## LUCKY LEPRECHAUN® CORNUS

*Cornus elliptica 'NCCE1' PP 26,542*

Lucky Leprechaun® Cornus is an extremely free flowering plant. The abundance of white blooms contrasts nicely with the dense, dark green foliage. It is compact in nature, and a plethora of blooms make it a great addition to the garden. It is also resistant to mildew, and in warmer climates, this plant remains evergreen.

ZONES: 7–9	FOLIAGE: Dark green
FLOWER: White	HABIT: Small tree, 13' h x 4–5' w



## PURPLE PLUNGE® PRUNUS

*Prunus cerasifera 'NCPR-7' PP 32,190*



Purple Plunge® has a unique, hanging, branching habit, which gives it a graceful, weeping growth form. This small tree has large, fragrant, blush pink flowers. Quick growing and adaptable to a wide variety of environments. Developed by the JC Raulston Arboretum at NC State University.

ZONES: 5–9	FOLIAGE: Burgundy
FLOWER: Blush pink	HABIT: Small weeping tree, 7–10' h x 3–4' w

## AMBER GLOW™ METASEQUOIA

*Metasequoia glyptostroboides 'WAH-08AG' PP 29,472*

This Metasequoia is a deciduous conifer, which has bright, golden foliage that emerges in the spring and becomes tinged with orange as the season progresses. The foliage doesn't burn in full sun. It has a dense, pyramidal habit and looks good at all stages of growth.

ZONES: 5–10	FOLIAGE: Golden tinged with orange
FLOWER: Non-flowering	HABIT: Compact, 30–35' (at 25 years of age)
