Hydrangea quercifolia 'Oakann1588' PPAF

SELLING FEATURES

- Compact habit with flowers held by strong stems high on the plant
- Very heavy flower set
- Easy to root in propagation
- Reblooming heavier in the fall than other market varieties
- Flowers are early to turn red in the fall
- Burgundy-bronze fall foliage color
- Less foliar disease than other market varieties

None needed PGRS: FINISHING TIMES: 3 gallon:

> • Transplant 21c in April, saleable in about 16-20 weeks

> • Transplant 21c in June-Sept, overwinter containers, saleable the following spring-summer

> • Transplant bareroot in Feb-March, saleable in June-July
